LORD MAYOR at 'PICNIC RALLY'


Adelaide Lord Mayor, Martin Haese, has confirmed he will attend the 'Save Rymill Park Picnic Rally' on Sunday 31 May.

APPA has called on the State Government to return the identified land to Park Lands - and THEN talk about whether or not a highway should be built through Rymill Park

PUBLIC WELCOME ON 'UNIVERSITY' PARK LANDS

A small victory! After much more than a year of effort, pushing and shoving by APPA Member Stephan Mavrakis and others, the Adelaide University has finally acknowledged, publicly, that it does not have authority to stop the public using the 'University' playing fields in the Park Lands.

In early May 2015, the old University Park Lands signs (left) were replaced with much more appropriate ones (right). The new ones make it much clearer that the public is not to be thrown out of the park, for playing there when the University is not using the facilities.


