



The 2021 State Budget released on Tuesday 22 June contained funding for not one, but three attacks on your Open Green Public Adelaide Park Lands.

A new stadium, a new hospital and a new multi-storey car park would each whittle away more of your Park 27, which has already been subjected to decades of Park erosion.
