
1. YOUR CHANCE TO BE A WHISTLEBLOWER FOR ADELAIDE

3. THOUGHT BUBBLES - BASEBALL STADIUM, CONCERT HALL

The most serious threats to your Open Green Public Park Lands are coming from the State Government, which has allocated funding in this year's State Budget to commence work for three attacks on your Park 27: :

- a \$660 million stadium or "Arena" which would destroy Helen Mayo Park;
- a new <u>Women's and Children's Hospital</u> on what is currently landscaped gardens; and
- a multi-storey car park on historic olive groves in Kate Cocks Park.

These threats are the most serious because preparatory work has actually commenced.

However, other unrelated threats are also on the horizon.

Two recent "thought bubbles" have emerged, from people who seem to believe that your Park Lands are not disappearing quickly enough.


A Melbourne-based property developer has laid out his vision for taking away part of your Open Green Public Park Lands, for his dream \$40 million sports stadium.

Multi-millionaire Ross Pelligra wants your land and a taxpayer subsidy to build a baseball stadium for his franchised team, the Adelaide Giants.
