2. "RIDICULOUS": GREEN ADELAIDE CHIEF SLAMS PARK REZONING PLANS

The chair of a State Government Board trying to make Adelaide "greener" and "wilder" has urged community groups to be "shouting from the rooftops" about the Government's "ridiculous" plans to turn over 70 hectares of river-front Adelaide Park Lands for development.

Professor Chris Daniels advocates "re-wilding" the River Torrens which puts him in conflict with Government plans for many new "Riverbank" buildings on your Open Green Public Park Lands.
